As a preschooler in Sunday School I remember learning this:

(Do it with me: <u>Put your knuckles together</u>, then enfold your fingers, and close your hands in a prayer-like posture.)

You may have learned this as a child as a way to explain a simple thing about being Christian: that togetherness is part of the Christian life. It just is. This togetherness helps us to know and love one another. There is, however, a shift happening in America whereby church attendance has dropped significantly across this country. God has not taken leave of this country, but that begs the question: Where are all of God's people?



CAN YOU HELP SET ME UP SO I CAN FRIEND AND LIKE JESUS, TEXT HIM MY PRAYERS, AND SHARE ALL HIS TWEETS?

Either God's people are only found in church on Sunday mornings or God's people are everywhere, all the time! God's people are found all over the place — at school and work, at the grocery store, at the hockey rink, on Snapchat, Twitter, Facebook and other social media platforms, at home, in homeless shelters, in prison, at coffee shops!

In the heyday of Christianity, the pews and Sunday School rooms were bursting at the seams. It seems however, that

God is telling us something different when we see fewer in the pews on Sunday mornings. It's the same message Jesus taught: Go Out!

Go out and train everyone you meet far and near, in this way of life, marking them by baptism in the threefold name: Father*, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Traditionally, every twelve years is the Year of the Pig (or Boar)—1935, 1947 1959, 1971, 1983, 1995 and so on. (It's the last of 12 animals on the Chinese zodiac). Those born during a year of the pig are supposedly honest, kind, gentle, selfless, compassionate, generous, diligent. Certainly admirable! We'd do well to include these qualities among our own New Year's resolutions!

As China's most important festival, it is, of course, a time of great celebration. For millions (e.g. parents of Stay Behind Children) it's the only time of year possible for returning home—if they can afford it. Planes, trains, buses, will be packed. And one can expect numerous accidents on the road and during celebrations, particularly since China's population is so dense—about four times that of the U.S.

Here at Amazing Grace, two days before the New Year, we will be celebrating Global Mission Sunday. As we pray for China that day, let us pray for the safety of the many millions of our brothers and sisters in China and for happiness during their reunions. Pray also for many Christians—and Muslims—who are now suffering persecution and will not be able to celebrate at all.

Calling All Computer Geeks

Amazing Grace is currently looking for an IT support specialist who would volunteer to help keep the church's network and computers operating efficiently, safely, and securely. Weekly support required is on average less than an hour per week, but on occasion it can spike to 4-5 hours.

Monthly maintenance is normally done after Microsoft releases their monthly updates, almost always the second Wednesday of the month. This is normally about 4 hours monthly for the 6 laptops we have for staff. Additionally, the 10 laptops for Sunday School require updating twice yearly, before and after the Sunday School season.

In addition, setting up a new computer or reconfiguring an old one when staff changes over takes 2-3 hours each. Maintaining the online accounts for new and existing staff can take an additional hour or two monthly.


February 1—March 31: Great Neighbors' Food Fight

Congregational Care. She works for us
only 10 hours a week, but in those
hours are filled with sharing the love of
Christ with those who need a kind
smile, an encouraging word, a

reminder of God's promise and Presence, and, sometimes a good belly laugh! Pastor Tess also:

Coordinates the "Hands and Feet" ministries
Leads a worship service with communion at Inver Glen
(the senior living residence next door to the church)
the first Thursday of every month at 10:00-10:30 am.
(Everyone is invited, even if they are not residents of Inver Glen.)

Provides back-up and assistance for Pastor Julie as needed and requested, such as: covering emergency calls, assisting in Sunday worship, and filling in when Pastor Julie is away, including preaching about once a month.

Amazing Grace's staff works with many other committed ministries of this church:

Funerals: Barb Malamen has a knack for hospitality! She coordinates funeral hospitality at Amazing Grace by providing food and beverages for those in grief.

Hands and Feet: Ministers with a love of God's people visit others in need of connection and prayer.

Meals: When meals for those in crisis or grief are needed, Lynda Bartlette does a great job coordinating volunteers to provide (comfort) food.

Rides: Norm Beckman, in his gracious generosity, locates volunteer drivers to provide rides on a short-term basis.

Personal Prayers: Linda Erickson coordinates personal prayer leaders who, during most worship services, provide one-to-one prayer during Holy Communion.

Prayer Chain: Mary Garfield helps us pray for all those with prayer requests through email alerts. These prayers are a key element to healing.

Prayer Shawls: Gifted knitters make prayer shawls, stitched with prayers of love which are then delivered to those in need of comfort.

Conducts visits, connecting with members who are home-bound, shut-in and in care facilities. Stops in to visit and participate with various ministry groups – "Knit & Chat," "OWLS," Vacation Bible School and others.
