

It's a Holy Spirit Thing

Lately I've been feeling a little rattled – in a good way. Do you ever get the feeling that God is up to something...but you can't quite put your finger on it? That's where I find myself at the start of this Lenten season. I've experienced this kind of thing before, years ago, and that's when God completely turned my life upside down and inside out. At that time, I was deciding whether or not to go to seminary. I said to my mother, "But I would be over age 40 by the time I become a pastor!" Her response: "Well, God willing, you'll be 40 someday anyway, so go for it!" Off I went, into uncharted territory, lit up by the Holy Spirit and wondering what in the world God would think up next. It was a scary time for me, in some respects, because I completely surrendered myself to God. And yet, it was also the most freeing time of my life! It was a time when I found myself singing and dancing in the kitchen and also down on my knees in prayer in that same kitchen. In that season in life, I was surprised on a regular basis by the work of the Holy Spirit. *Instead of trying to figure out the Spirit, I simply decided to pay attention and enjoy the ride*.


Attending a conference last month about church revitalization, I was introduced to a book called, **"8 Virtues of Rapidly Growing Churches"** by Matt Miofsky and Jason Byassee. They suggest that the #1 virtue is:

Rapidly Growing Churches Believe in Miracles and Act Accordingly

They explain that churches that believe in miracles pray differently, see differently, and most importantly begin to act differently. It turns out that:

"Acting like the Holy Spirit is up to something in our midst is the single greatest game-changing decision a church can make." Why does it matter how you and I pray, see and act? Because if God is about to do something amazing, I want to be part of it – and I'm guessing you do, too. When we look and expect to see evidence of God at work, we will see things we have not noticed before. When we pray with boldness, it focuses our thoughts and energy and then prepares us for what lies ahead. Prayer helps us to let go of what we want and prepare us to receive what God desires for us.

When we take action as a faith community, and as individuals, having already been grounded in prayer and attentiveness to the Spirit, then our actions will speak louder than all of our words combined. As we make our way through the remaining days of Lent, I ask for your prayers for this faith community. **Pray with boldness. See with new eyes. Listen for the whispers of the Spirit.** And one more thing: **share stories about what God is doing.** Maybe you're like me: paying attention, ready to see and tell of God's transforming power. What is God up to? I don't know...yet. *It's a Holy Spirit thing.*

From the Children and Youth Minister

As you might recall during my time here, we have served at Lutheran Social Service's (LSS) Rezek House numerous times. It is a residence for homeless teens. We anticipate working with them again this summer during our Summer Servants experience. I wanted to share a couple of stories provided by them about the great work that is done there each day. This organization works with youth to become stable, able to access resources and to be more productive. Here are two examples of the work done at Rezek's Transitional Living Project:

Youth 1: successfully exited from the program after being with us for 2.5 years. She is now in her apartment and is doing well. While being a part of our program, one thing she learned was developing healthy boundaries with her family.

Youth 2: increased her income to over \$40,000 annually. Taking full advantage of all opportunities provided to her, with the suggestion of her Case Manager, she successfully completed a program that allowed her to secure a car to get to work safely. She has been stably housed for over a year and is now gainfully employed in a career she enjoys!

In February, five new youth moved into this program. As new youth move in there is a need for new apartment supplies. Last summer we cleaned, prepared, and stocked two apartments that had become available. These are some of the items that are needed.

- Mops/brooms
- Hygiene products: toothpaste, tooth brushes, body wash, deodorant
- Can openers
- Pillows
- All purpose cleaners
- Dish drying rack
- Pot holders, etc

We are fortunate to have Wendy Hoffman as our LSS representative here at Amazing Grace. If there are questions, or you would like to know more about this ministry with which our youth are involved, please talk to me or Wendy.

Continue to pray for all the roughly 6,000 youth who are homeless on <u>our</u> streets each night.

WOMEN'S RETREAT APRIL 29—MAY 3, 2019



These books are located in the Amazing Grace bookshelf, in the Upper Room. Books can be borrowed and then returned so that others from the community may enjoy them.






The Race Myth: Why We Pretend Race Exists in America by Joseph L. Graves, Jr.: Preeminent evolutionary biologist Joseph Graves proves once and for all that it doesn't. He explains why defining race according to skin tone or eye shape is woefully inaccurate, and how making assumptions based on these false categories regarding IQ, behavior, or predisposition to disease has devastating effects.

White Like Me: Reflections on Race from a Privileged Son by Tim Wise

Using stories from his own life, Tim Wise demonstrates the ways in which racism not only burdens people of color, but also benefits, in relative terms, those who are "white like him." He discusses how racial privilege can harm whites in the long run and make progressive social change less likely. - Coordinates the "Hands and Feet" ministries
- Leads a worship service with communion at Inver Glen (the senior living residence next door to the church) the first Thursday of every month at 10:00-10:30 am. (Everyone

is invited, even if they are not residents of Inver Glen.)

- Provides back-up and assistance for Pastor Julie as needed and requested, such as: covering emergency calls, assisting in Sunday worship, and filling in when Pastor Julie is away, including preaching about once a month.
- Conducts visits, connecting with members who are home -bound, shut-in and in care facilities. Stops in to visit and participate with various ministry groups – "Knit & Chat," "OWLS," Vacation Bible School and others.
- The most important ministry that Pastor Tess provides for Amazing Grace Lutheran Church is PRAYER. She regularly and faithfully prays for those whose names cross her desk or are called to mind by the Spirit.

- **Rides**: Norm Beckman, in his generosity, locates volunteer drivers to provide rides on a short-term basis.
- Personal Prayers: Linda Erickson coordinates personal prayer leaders who, during most worship services, provide one-to-one prayer during Holy Communion.
- **Prayer Chain**: Mary Garfield helps us pray for all those with prayer requests through email alerts. These prayers are a key element to healing. Call 612-834-2955
- **Prayer Shawls**: Gifted knitters make prayer shawls, stitched with prayers of love which are then delivered to those in need of comfort.

Tim, as our Children and Youth Minister, works with Pastor Julie and Pastor Tess on various pastoral duties, especially as they apply to the children, youth and families of the congregation. In addition, Tim spends time out in the community at events that impact our youth – their concerts, sports games, volunteering, school events, fundraisers – letting the kids and their families know that the church is not just in the church building, but in the world with them.
