Dear Amazing Grace,

"Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

In a matter of weeks, you will hear these words as ash is smudged upon your forehead. This year, Ash Wednesday happens to fall on Valentine's Day, February 14. The date when Ash Wednesday falls varies from year to year and is based on the timing of Easter (which always falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the Spring equinox). Notably, Ash Wednesday has fallen on Valentine's Day once before in my career—in 2018. The dates will line up once more in 2029 and then not again until well into next century (long after I hope to retire!).

I think this is worth noting, not just because it's a rare alignment but because the two holidays complement each other so well. Valentine's is a day in our culture when people celebrate the love in our lives. It's a day to remember that we belong to, and with, one another. Likewise, Ash Wednesday is a day to remember...

...our death?

Wait, something isn't lining up here. What alignment could we possibly detect between Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday? One holiday is about love, which, the Apostle Paul tells us, is eternal. "Love never ends," Paul writes in I Corinthians. The other holiday is all about our finitude, our mortality, the fragmented nature of being human. One holiday is all colorful hearts and roses, and the other is sackcloth and ashes. They seem so different from one another.

Yet, I want you to notice something about Ash Wednesday. When you come forward and you hear the truth about your created nature, "You are dust and to dust you shall return," you will also receive ashes in the shape of a cross. This is where we start to see that maybe the two days do belong together after all.

You see, Ash Wednesday is certainly a reminder of our mortality, but it's also a celebration of our ashen, mortal bodies. It's a day when we realize that the finite bears the infinite. The precise location where the drama of transcendent love is played out is within and among our mortal bodies, which will someday return to dust. It's in these finite bodies that we receive, witness, and participate in the eternal love of God in Christ. The reminder of

We celebrate love on Ash Wednesday because God loves us in all our finitude, in all our brokenness, throughout this ashen life. Just as Valentine's Day reminds us that we belong to our loves, so does Ash Wednesday remind us that we belong to God. For this, we can say, thanks be to God.

#### February 25 Anxious People by Fredrik Bachman

Taken hostage by a failed bank robber while attending an open house, eight anxiety - prone strangers discover their unexpected common traits.

#### March 24 The Seed Keeper by Diane Wilson a book in the bag selection

A haunting novel spanning several generations **The Seed Keeper** follows a Dakotah family's struggle to preserve their way of life, and protect what matters most.

#### April 28 The Paris Library by Janet Skeslien Charles

This book is based of the true story of the heroic librarians at the American Library in Paris during WWII. It reminds us of the importance of libraries, books and the human connections that can be found in both.

#### May 19 The Wind Knows My Name by Isabel Allende

The lives of a Jewish boy escaping Nazi-occupied Europe and a mother and daughter fleeing 21st century El Salvador intersect in this novel about war and immigration.

#### June 23 Leave No Trace by Mindy Mejia

A man and his son go on a camping trip to the Boundary Waters of northern Minnesota. They fail to return and searchers find their camp site ravaged as by a bear. The pair is presumed dead. Ten years later the son reappears. He is violent and uncommunicative. Can anyone reach him and fill in the previous ten years.

#### July 28 Deacon King Kong by James McBride

In September 1969, a cranky old church deacon known as Sportcoat shuffles into the courtyard of a housing project, pulls a gun from his pocket and in front of all shoots the project's drug dealer at point blank range. The reasons for and the consequences of this act are at the heart of this novel.

#### August 25 Loyalty by Lisa Scottoline

This book is an emotional, action-packed epic of love and justice set during the rise of the Mafia in Sicily.

#### September 22 Apples Never Fall by Liane Moriarty a book in the bag selection

If your mother was missing would you tell the police? Even if the most obvious suspect was your father? This is the situation faced by the Delaney children. Two of the children think their father is innocent; while two are not so sure. As the two sides square off against each other, all will begin to reexamine their shared family history.

#### October 27 The Unsettled by Ayana Mathis

This is a multigenerational novel set in the 1980's in racially and politically turbulent Philadelphia and the tiny town of Bonapart, Alabama about a mother fighting for her sanity and her survival.

#### November 24 The Secret Book of Flora Lea by Patti Callahan Henry

When a woman stumbles across a mysterious children's book, long-held secrets about her missing sister and their childhood spent in the English countryside during WWII are revealed.
