Dear Amazing Grace,

As most parents would say, becoming a father has been one of the most meaningful and joyful experiences of my life. It's also been one of the most surprising. This is because of all the supplemental joys that come with being a parent—joys like taking a music class with my kid or watching Charlotte form relationships with the people of AGLC. One of the unexpected auxiliary delights of becoming a dad has been the relationships Lindsey and I have been able to form with others because of Charlotte.

For over five years I have lived two doors down from another young family. Before Charlotte came along, we would greet one another with smiles and waves, but it never went beyond that. However, we discovered last spring that our kid and their kids are on the same bedtime schedule. Because of that, they have the same "zoomy" schedule. This is the time of night when the little ones just need to expend some energy. It didn't take long for us to start hanging out nearly every night

while our kids played and tired themselves out before bed. We've come to know our neighbors because we mutually benefit from spending time together. Having the support and friendship of our neighbors is a source of strength and joy for all of us.

The growth of this relationship has led me to consider more seriously a question that Jesus addresses in the Gospel of Luke: Who is my neighbor?

See, in Luke 10, Jesus is teaching when a lawyer stands up to test him. He asks Jesus what he must do to inherit eternal life. Jesus points the man back to the core of his own faith—loving God and loving the neighbor. In reply, the lawyer asks, "And who is my neighbor?" To this question, Jesus gives an unexpected and even potentially shocking response. He tells the story of the Good Samaritan. That is, a man falls into the hands of robbers and is left for dead on the side of the road. Religious and scholarly types walk by-people who should care because they know that love of God and love of neighbor go together. These respected people, however, show no interest in the man and pass by. Soon, a despised Samaritan walks by and actually stops. The Samaritan takes extreme measures to care for the beaten man. Jesus then turns the question back to the lawyer and asks which of these are acting as neighbors.

This story tells us three things about who our neighbors are. First, neighbors are not only the people who live right next door. Proximity is not the most important key to define neighbors. Second, the ethnic identity of the Samaritan would have shocked the audience. For hundreds of years, Jesus' fellow countrypeople had been harshly divided from the Samaritans. There was bad blood on both sides, rooted in religious and cultural differences. So, we learn that neighbors are not necessarily people who look, act, or think like us. They are even our supposed enemies! Finally, when Jesus asks who the neighbor to the beaten man was, the lawyer rightly says that the Samaritan was acting as a neighbor more than the pious passersby. Neighborliness, we learn, is lived out in compassionate action.

When we ask seriously who our neighbors are and when come to know them as beloved children of God, we cannot help but support and serve one another. Knowing our neighbors is meant to lead to

loving service.

The season of Advent kicks off a new church year. This year, our Gospel readings will come mostly from the book of Luke, where this story originates. Since it is a "Luke year," I think it's appropriate for us to spend time dwelling on the question, "Who is my neighbor?" This core question will guide my own devotional times, personal reflection, and decision-making processes. As a church, we'll take up this question in our worship, education, service, outreach, and even in our strategic work and council leadership. We will aim to let our neighbors define themselves and prepare ourselves to be surprised and delighted by what we learn as we meet the God who is already present in the lives and communities of those around us.

So, Amazing Grace, who is your neighbor?

Hello Amazing Grace friends,

Did you know that Scholarship funding is the largest investment that the partnered St. Paul Area Synod (SPAS) churches make in Tanzania each year? In 2024, SPAS churches combined sponsored:

- I,010 Secondary School Students
- 30 Post-Secondary Students
- 17 Theological Education by Extension (TEE) classes for 17 unpartnered parishes

The average annual cost of secondary school for a student in the Iringa Area Diocese is now over \$500/year. AGLC's current generosity is providing 2 students from the Magulilwa Parish with full or partial scholarships and has also consistently provided TEE classes for the church's evangelists.

YOUR HELP is NEEDED to support more students as scholarship funding is above and beyond the partnership support provided through mission giving. AGLC has pledged \$1,400/year in the past and we would like to challenge our community to increase that support to \$2,000 or more for 2025. What better gift to give that person who has everything or to honor family members with this Christmas?
