Dear Amazing Grace,

"All of our humanity is dependent on recognizing the humanity in others." Archbishop Desmond Tutu

A few nights before Christmas a small group from AGLC got together to discuss the book, God Has a Dream: A Vision of Hope for Our Times by Archbishop Desmond Tutu. Together, we learned some of Rev. Tutu's story and, based on his ideas, discussed what it looks like to cultivate hope in our lives. Among the many insights we shared were a couple of important ideas.

First, the cultivation of hope in our lives does not mean that we are meant to close our eyes and ears to the suffering in ourselves or the world around us. Looking squarely at injustice and getting involved in overcoming it tends to impel us to hope. Desmond Tutu's own life is a testament to this fact, as he was a lead voice in the anti-apartheid movement and later the truth and reconciliation commission, the aim of which was to find a way forward for all

the diverse people of South Africa.

This brings us to the second core idea in the cultivation of hope: recognition and celebration of our interdependence. The quote at the beginning of this newsletter perfectly encapsulates this idea. Behind the healing work of the truth and reconciliation commission was an honest effort to recognize the humanity of others, even those considered to be one's enemies. Practitioners of nonviolent transformation will always point to the humanity of the enemy in much the same way that Jesus did when he commanded us to love our enemies and do good to those who harm us.

In an age where we are regularly encouraged to demonize those who are different from us and consider them somehow less than human, it is important to cling to this command to recognize the humanity we share with all people. This is not an erasure of difference, but a celebration of the uniqueness and diversity of God's creation. In this way, cultivating hope for another kind of world, another kind of community, or what Jesus called the Kingdom of God, necessarily means standing against the temptation to create hierarchies of worth around our differences.

Later this month, we will observe the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day in

our nation. In a 1960 essay entitled, "Pilgrimage to Nonviolence," Dr. King describes his own journey to becoming a person of hope, committed to God's vision of the Kingdom or the Beloved Community as he was wont to call it. It began with a recognition of his own humanity in a world where he was told he was less than human because of the color of his skin. That is, it began with squarely looking at the injustice and suffering he experienced and witnessed. He writes, "The first time that I was seated behind a curtain in a dining car I felt as if the curtain had been dropped on my selfhood. I had also just learned that the inseparable twin of racial injustice is economic injustice. I saw how the systems of segregation ended up in the exploitation of the Negro as well as the poor whites." His own experience of suffering linked him in common humanity with others who were also suffering under the hand of oppression.

Amazing Grace, we are called to be people of hope. We can cultivate hope by engaging the world in all its

problems and consistently reminding ourselves and others of the humanity even of our enemies.

People of the Minneapolis and Saint Paul Area Synods will have opportunities to cultivate hope together this month.
